### Great Lent and Holy Week Services

Great Lent begins on Monday, March 18. Please see the listing of Holy Week Services on page 3. Although there are no services listed for the Salutations to the Theotokos and the Akathist Hymn through the fifth Friday of Great Lent, the sanctuary will be open for prayer from 5:30 p.m. through 7:30 p.m.

The Eastern Orthodox Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday, April 28 and Easter / Holy Pascha will be celebrated on Sunday, May 5. The Palm Sunday Divine Liturgy will be held at 10:30 a.m. Blessed palms will be distributed at the conclusion of the service. The service of the Bridegroom is scheduled for approximately 1:00 p.m. on Palm Sunday afternoon. The Service of the Sacrament of Holy Unction will be held on late Wednesday afternoon at 5:00 pm, followed by a Vesperal Divine Liturgy at 6:30 pm.

There will be no services on Holy Monday, Holy Tuesday, Holy Thursday and Holy Saturday. The sanctuary will be open from 5:30 p.m. - 7:30 p.m. on those days. On Holy Friday the Great Vespers Service of the removal of Christ from the cross will be held at 4:00 p.m. followed by an abbreviated Lamentations Service at 5:30 p.m.

The Easter / Holy Pascha Sunday Services will begin with Orthros at 9:30 a.m. followed by the Resurrection Service at 10:00 a.m. The Divine Liturgy will start promptly at 10:30 a.m. The Great Vespers Agape Service will be held at approximately 11:45 a.m. Following the services, a coffee hour will take place in the church hall.

Father Philip will be available to those who wish to receive Holy Communion and / or a home blessing and prayer. Should you desire an appointment, please contact Father Philip at (315) 468-4814 or you may leave a message on the church answering machine by telephoning (315) 788-4920.

### Parish House Renovations

The Parish House garage roof which is flat and surrounded by a balustrade required repairs. The rubber roof which was installed in 2008 deteriorated and needed replacement.

A leak began to form on the left wall above the windows and water began to seep inside of the garage. Therefore, the rubber roof was replaced and gaco, a roof sealant, was applied to the new rubber roof. Furthermore, there was an inspection of the remaining posts in order to prevent additional problems. There was damage to the exterior molding by the double windows as well as a small portion of the ceiling inside of the garage. The balustrade was cleaned as mold had formed on them. The trim that surrounds the garage was scraped, primed and painted.

Additional cleaning was completed on the chimney as it became a catchment area of dirt and debris which

seemed to have been deposited from the attic roof. A vent near the roof on the back of the church was also secured in order to prevent squirrels from gaining entry. The work was completed by Chris Patchen of C.M. Patchen Contracting, LLC, Watertown at a cost of \$6,850.00 (including debris removal). The pictures to the right shows some of what was needed and required in the project. A concern exists for the condition of the Parish House attic roof and estimates will be sought within the next year or two. It was recommended that the Parish House garage roof be inspected each year in order to prevent further problems.

### **Holy Week Donations**



Saint John Climacus the Righteous, Author of the Divine Ladder of Ascent Feast Days: Saturday, March 30 and the Fourth Sunday of Great Lent, April 14

Saint John Climacus gave himself over to the ascetical life in his early youth. He was experienced in the solitary life of a hermit and in the communal

ascetical life in his early youth. He was experienced in the solitary life of a hermit and in the communal life of monasticism. He was appointed as the abbot of the Monastery at Mount Sinai. Saint John Climacus wrote a book containing thirty homilies on virtue. "The Ladder of the Divine Ascent" teaches ones who seeks salvation how to lay a sound foundation for his or her struggles. Furthermore, it instructs one on how to detect a war against each of the passions and how to avoid snares laid by the demons. It provides the individual with how one may give rise to virtuous principles in order to achieve Godlike love and humility.

Kontakion of the Sunday of Saint John Climacus: "Truly the Lord has set you in the sky of abstinence, as a fixed star giving light to ends of the world, O John, our teacher and Father."

### Winter 2023 - 2024

On January 9-10 a powerful wind storm produced gusts to nearly 80 mph. There were power outages throughout Northern New York and minor tree damage was discovered on the parish house grounds.

As of February 29, approximately 78 inches of snow had fallen in the City of Watertown since November. It is anticipated that the snow removal costs will be significantly less than last winter.

For the past 20 years, Paul completed several projects at Saint Vasilios Church and Parish House, including renovations of the church bathrooms, sump replacements, heating upgrades and numerous other repairs.
