

General Assembly Meeting

A General Meeting will be held in the sanctuary on October 27 at 11:45 a.m.. in order to discuss scheduled services and other matters be of business. An important discussion will be held about what options are available for our future which may affect our present form of worship. There is a shortage of priests in the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese which includes the United and States and Canada and in other Eastern Orthodox jurisdictions.

It was indicated by the Archdiocesan officials that it has no plan to close churches. Their position on the issue is that it is the will of the people as to whether or not a decision is made about a church closure. This is taken by vote of the parish council and general membership. Presently, our parish is financially stable; however, there are major concerns about the younger generation assuming leadership roles which require time, commitment and hard work. It is very advantageous to receive the financial donations, but there needs to be involvement by those that are able to assist in the operations of the parish.

Recently, it was learned that the Metropolitan Nicholas has requested that Father Philip Yanulis celebrate the Divine Liturgy at the Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church in Vestal, New York. There has not been an assigned priest at that parish for several months. Therefore, Father Philip will be required to serve other parishes since there is a shortage of Eastern Orthodox priests. Weather Notes

The City of Watertown had a very warm and humid July & August with heavy amounts of rain produced by Tropical Storm Beryl in July and Tropical Storm Debby in August. During the month of July 5.99 inches of rain fell in the City of Watertown, and in August a total of 7.23 inches of precipitation fell in the city of Watertown. This was measured at the City of Watertown's Filtration Plant. It was reported on Newzjunky.com that the City of Watertown had the wettest summer on record with a total of 20.02 inches of rain. Measurements were taken during the months of June, July and August.

Flash flooding in the region resulted in damage to schools, roadways, homes, riverbanks and infrastructure. The church had minor flooding in some sections of the basement during both July and August. Thankfully, it was cleaned up in a matter of hours. A drain in the parish house basement was cleared of debris and there was only minor flooding in July. The parish house and church rain gutters will need to be examined, but during a flash flood diverting water away from these structures is nearly impossible.

For over 30 years, he remained dedicated to his career in hospitality, working his way up to food and beverage manager at Hueston Woods Lodge to the Director of State Parks Regency Hotel management.
